ALUMNAE STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

Portland Alumnae Panhellenic is offering a scholarship for the 2009-2010 academic year. The purpose of this scholarship is to assist a sorority alumna member who needs financial assistance to complete her undergraduate degree, to earn an advanced degree, or to earn credits to aid in a career change. The scholarship may be used at an accredited college or university, in a career-oriented training program, or at a vocational school. Awards are granted on the basis of financial need, leadership, and service in an alumnae and/or community group.

The applicant must be a permanent resident of the Portland metropolitan area (Clackamas, Clark, Multnomah, or Washington Counties), who is returning for further education beyond her sophomore year. She must be an initiated, dues-paying member of a National Panhellenic Conference sorority and must have been active in an alumnae group. There is no limit to the number of applicants from each sorority.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

ALL STEPS MUST BE FOLLOWED, OR APPLICANT WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

1. Complete the attached application. Additional forms are available from your Alumnae Chapter Panhellenic Delegate or from the Portland Panhellenic Scholarship Chair listed below.
2. Include the following documents with your application:
 - a. Personal letter explaining your interests, activities (sorority and community), educational goals, and the nature of your financial need. This letter should help us get to know you.
 - b. Letter of recommendation from a member of your sorority alumnae group.
 - c. Letter of recommendation from an employer, member of your school's faculty, or an acquaintance who is not a relative.

NOTE: The two letters of recommendation should be in sealed envelopes with the signature of the author over the seal to protect confidentiality.

3. Place all papers and letters of recommendation in a lightweight folder with your name on the outside. Mail the packet to Suzanne Robbel –See Roster for information. If desired, you may email the application and personal letter to Suzanne at [vpPanhellenic](#). If you do email these items, please make a note when you send the recommendation letters.

COMPLETE APPLICATION MUST BE RECEIVED BY APRIL 30, 2009

Failure to supply any of the required information will automatically disqualify a candidate. The award winner will be notified after May 31, 2009. The scholarship award will be sent to the business or financial aid office of the college or university of the recipient with instructions to disburse the funds for **tuition only**, divided equally between terms or semesters.
